#### **SEA ICE**

- 1 Sea ice is found in **remote** polar oceans. On average, sea ice covers about 25 million square kilometers of the earth, or about two-and-a-half times the area of Canada. Because most of us do not live in the polar regions, we may live for several decades and never see sea ice. Although it may not directly affect us, it is a critical component of our planet because it influences climate, wildlife, and people who live in the Arctic.
- Sea ice is simply frozen ocean water. It forms, grows, and melts in the ocean. In contrast, icebergs, glaciers, ice sheets, and ice shelves all originate on land. Sea ice occurs in both the Arctic and Antarctic. In the Northern Hemisphere, it can currently **exist** as far south as Bohai Bay, China, which is actually about 700 kilometers closer to the Equator than it is to the North Pole. In the Southern Hemisphere, sea ice only develops around Antarctica, occurring as far north as 55 degress south latitude. Sea ice grows during the winter months and melts during the summer months, but some sea ice remains all year in certain regions. About 15 percent of the world's oceans are covered by sea ice during the year.
- Even though sea ice occurs primarily in the polar regions, it influences our global climate. Sea ice has a bright surface, so much of the sunlight that strikes it is reflected back into space. As a result, areas covered by sea ice don't absorb much solar energy, so temperatures in the polar regions remain relatively cool. If gradually warming temperatures melt sea ice over time, fewer bright surfaces are available to reflect sunlight back into space, more solar energy is absorbed at the surface, and temperatures rise further. This chain of events starts a cycle of warming and melting. This cycle is temporarily **halted** when the dark days of the polar winter return, but it starts again in the following spring. Even a small increase in temperature can lead to greater warming over time, making the polar regions the most sensitive areas to climate change on Earth.
- 5 Sea ice also affects the movement of ocean waters. When sea ice forms, most of the salt is pushed into the ocean water below the ice, although some salt may become trapped in small pockets



between ice crystals. Water below sea ice has a higher concentration of salt and is more **dense** than surrounding ocean water, and so it sinks. In this way, sea ice contributes to the ocean's global "conveyorbelt" circulation. Cold, dense, polar water sinks and moves along the ocean bottom toward the equator, while warm water from mid-depth to the surface travels from the equator toward the poles. Changes in the amount of sea ice can disrupt normal ocean circulation, thereby leading to changes in global climate.

### The Gig Economy

Technically, the word *gig* means job, but these days it has a special flavour of its own. As linguist Geoff Nurnberg states in a National Public Radio commentary, in the 1950s it referred to "any job you took to keep body and soul together while your real life was elsewhere." In other words, a gig was not necessarily part of a career, nor was it work that defined you. In recent years, however, it has come to mean any kind of temporary job. It makes sense, then, that the word is now part of a new work-related term: *the gig economy*. The U.S. Bureau of Labour Statistics (BLS) defines *gig* in this context as "a single project or task for which a worker is hired, often through a digital marketplace, to work on demand." This might include working on one project at a time until each is finished, writing for publications or websites, or having a catering business that operates only



- when a job is offered. Common fields that employ freelancers include graphic design, information technology, technical writing, and construction. In the U.S., there has been a noticeable rise in this type of work arrangement over the past decade.
- The benefits of this system make it appealing, particularly to young single people. It enables them to choose their own schedules, to limit their work to interesting projects (as long as they earn enough to pay their bills), and to accumulate experience in different kinds of work. Nowadays we often hear about people working for a period and then traveling for a period, and so on. This kind of lifestyle would be impossible for someone working for a company in a fixed full-time position, which usually includes only two or three weeks' vacation per year. Such permanent employees are otherwise expected to be present to make decisions and fulfil ongoing responsibilities. On the other hand, the drawbacks of freelance work are clear: there is much less security than in traditional careers, and there are generally no traditional employee benefits such as private health insurance plans and paid sick days. Furthermore, freelance incomes tend to fluctuate, which can be stressful. Unfortunately, many people who would prefer a more traditional working life have been forced to take on a collection of lower-paying part-time jobs out of necessity rather than out of a desire for professional freedom. For them, a series of gigs is a minus instead of a plus.
- It is difficult for the U.S. government to track the number of freelance workers accurately, or the rate of increase in the gig sector. However, data from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), the government's tax administration, does offer some clues. Most people operating very small, unincorporated businesses with no employees can be classified as members of the gig economy, and between 2003 and 2013 there was notable growth in such "nonemployer businesses" in all industry sectors. In the category not associated with any one industry, called the "other services" sector, there was an increase of nearly 1 million nonemployer businesses during that same period. As the BLS notes on its website, many of the jobs reflected in this last sector would be considered gig employment, such as repair work and individual babysitting jobs. And with the rapid growth of companies like Uber, Lyft, and Airbnb, it appears this business trend will continue to increase on a large scale as the labour force and economy adjust.
