# Getting help: Office Hours vs. Online Study Groups

Even the brightest students get stuck once in a while. The significant difference between the student who eventually 'gets it' and the one who can't end up being the way they reach out for help. Going to see a teacher during office hours can be a reliable way to receive extra support; however, the modern phenomenon of the internet has made online study groups the more popular choice. Students have to weigh their options and decide which route to take.

One important aspect of talking face-to-face is that both student and teacher get to know each other personally. This helps to expand the student's perspective and encourages the student to think beyond his or her field. This also puts an apprehensive student more at ease, thus allowing that student to become more engaged in the topic. Personal interaction between student and teacher in a less formal setting can also result in an improved understanding of the material taught in class. A visit during office hours can also motivate a student to think more deeply about a topic. A student can discuss a thesis with a teacher, for example, and develop it over a long period.

Online study groups, on the other hand, present a credible alternative to meeting the teacher at a specific place and time. Due to technological advances in the past decade or so, students can ask each other questions in real time in order to clarify assignments or concepts associated with the course. Location and time are no longer factors for those who are looking for help with a class. This has united students in a unique way.

Each method of study has its drawbacks, however. An online study group might not be able to help with a specific question. The explanation may pale in comparison to the teacher's clarification on the subject. But inperson office hours can be difficult to plan a school assignment around. While many teachers Schedule extra office hours during the week of final exams, a lot of them off er no more than a few hours per week of scheduled office hours. This may not be suitable for the student who has an urgent assignment due.

Students should choose the method that works best for them. They can either visit a teacher in person during office hours, or turn to an online study group, or even use a combination of both. The decision will most likely depend on the assignment and the urgency of the issue at hand.

# Text 2:

# **Conserving Planet Earth**

When we hear the word 'conservation', we often think of renovating old buildings, rescuing historic structures from demolition preserving valuable artworks. However, the most important conservation project must be the effort to save planet Earth. Scientists have pinpointed 1965 as the year when humans began to leave a significant impact on the planet. That was the year when the fallout from atomic testing became discernible in the environment. This new geological period is known as the Anthropocene, from the Greek anthropo (man) and cene (new). There are different views among the scientific community about whether the damage is irreversible, but the consensus is that our planet is in deep trouble. If humanity does not take better care of the environment and nature, slowly but surely we will irreparably damage it.

It is easy to feel helpless in response to the depressing statistics and the dire predictions.

However, there are ways that each of us can contribute to the health of our planet. In recent years, as people have become increasingly concerned about the environment and sustainability, they are opting for more constructive and meaningful ways to spend their vacations, other than simply sightseeing or lying beside a pool. This newfound sense of global responsibility has prompted ecotourism to become the fastest growing sector of the tourism industry.

These days, ecotourism companies offer a wide range of scenarios that match volunteers with projects that are compatible with their skill set, energy level, time availability and countries and cultures that interest them. Families can participate in bird-tracking and organicgardening activities on the Indonesian island of Simeulue. Adventurous types can join a reforestation project in the Amazon jungle, which involves a ten-hour bus trip from Cusco, Peru, and living conditions that can be rough. For animal lovers, there are projects to help save vulnerable species from extinction. Not all species are adaptive to the changing climate and other threats. Guatemala offers a sea turtle conservation programme where volunteers retrieve and relocate eggs to protect them from predators.

For those who are handy with tools, there are construction and renovation projects, such as building homes and schools in rural towns. For those who prefer to stay closer to home or for the less affluent who cannot afford airline tickets to foreign destinations, there are local options available. Just being a responsible consumer can make a significant contribution towards protecting the environment. Changing everyday habits and practices, such as limiting the use of plastic and participating in neighbourhood recycling programmes, can help to conserve our planet's resources. Volunteering in community parks and gardens, planting trees – the lungs of the Earth – and cleaning up litter are all productive conservation activities. Plus, community activities are a great way to make new friends. Researchers at the University of North Carolina in the US have confirmed that social connections can increase longevity. So, community involvement is not only good for the planet, but also for our health. And I believe that future generations who will inhabit our planet will thank us.
